

Fees & Payments



Tuition fees

If you normally live in the UK or the European Union (EU), you will be liable to pay the home tuition fee rate. If you do not normally live in the UK or EU, you will be charged international fees, which are usually higher. The fees will also be different if you are studying part-time or at postgraduate level. The rules around fee status are complex and if you are unsure which level of fee will be applied to you, contact the student finance advisers in Student Services, who can help with any enquiries.

Full-time home (UK) and European (EU) undergraduate students

The fee for continuing students will be £3,465 for most undergraduate programmes. Here are the fees for new undergraduate students starting their first year of study in 2012-13.

£7,450 for programmes in:

- History
- English
- Law
- Criminal Investigation
- Sociology and Youth Studies
- Education
- Business
- Performing Arts

£7,950 for programmes in:

- Computing
- Psychology
- Sport
- Art and Design
- Media
- Social Work

£8,450 for programmes in:

- Science and Engineering
- Animation Games and Computer Graphics
- Web and Multimedia

There are exceptions to this – if you are studying a programme which is funded by the National Health Service or, in some cases, if you began studying in higher education before September 2006.

You may be able to take out a loan to cover all or part of your tuition fees.

Full-time international students

If you normally live in a country outside the EU you will not get support towards tuition fees from the UK government. The level of fee you will need to pay may vary.

The fees for 2012-13 are:

• undergraduate	£10,450
• postgraduate	£10,950
• MBA	£12,950
• placement year	£1,100
• international foundation year	£9,450

Some fees may differ, so you must check the fees for your programme. You will receive a 5% discount on your fees after the International Scholarship of £1,500 has been deducted, provided you pay your fees in full before enrolment. Most international students are required to pay 50% of the year's fees before a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) number can be released.

Postgraduate fees

The standard full-time fee for home or EU students on most postgraduate taught and research programmes in 2012-13 will range between £4,455 and £5,220 depending on your chosen programme. Details of exceptions to this, and of part-time postgraduate fees, can be found at: tees.ac.uk/parttime.

Paying tuition fees

The University operates a number of payment options for paying your tuition fees:

1. Payment in full
2. Payment in three installments
3. Payment in monthly installments over seven months

Making payments

You can pay by visiting the University's online shop: onlineshop.tees.ac.uk. Follow the link for Product Catalogue/University Services and Facilities/Student payments.

If you opt to pay by three or seven instalments and have missed any payment dates in the recurring credit/debit card plan all arrears will be taken from your credit or debit card on the day you set up your recurring credit/debit card plan.

The Cash Office is on the ground floor of the Middlesbrough Tower. You can pay invoices between 9.00am and 4.30pm Monday to Thursday (with the exception of Wednesday after 12.00pm) and 9.00am and 4.00pm on Fridays.

The cash office accepts:

- cash | • cheque (made payable to Teesside University)
- credit/debit card | • postal order | • banker's draft.

If you want to pay at the cash office you will need to bring something with your enrolment number on (for example, your TUSC). This will help us serve you quickly and efficiently.

International students can pay in their home currency by using our Student Pay facility which is available online: tees.ac.uk/sections/international/fees_paying.cfm.

If you want to collect a bursary or payment from the Cash Office, you will need to bring something which confirms that you are enrolled and something else confirming your identity (for example, your passport). This will help us prevent fraud and deal with you efficiently. We are here to help if you ever have problems with payments owing to the University. This includes bills for tuition fees, accommodation, library fines, emergency loans and nursery fees.
